## Mary (Frank) Firth

Mary chan yi'èenji' Yukon ts'aii gwà'àn vagòonlii gwàt nijìn gwà'àn łòo gàhdandaih kwàa December 23, 1935 dài' zrah. Adanh łòo tr'iinin ihłok gwijùutin ts'àt ihłak tat nilii gòo viyùughwan kat chan John akòo Rebecca Modeste giinlì'. Dahanh ts'aii dìtsii dìtsuu hah t'at Robert George, Annie G. goovàazhii iinlì'. Ditì' ts'aii dìtsii dìtsuu kat hàh chan Old Modeste Ts'idehdi'(Tsetetti) ànts'àt Macrena kat hàh giinlì'.

Nìch'it zhuu nilii dài' t'at dachan tat diyuughwan kat dìtsii dìtsuu kat hàh gogweech'in' ganadhindaih nùh. Vaghàii nihk'iitik goozhik School yi'eedi' Aklavik gwizhìt nèetr'inyahchih chan nùh. Khaii nihk'iitik gahshùk nihk'eedilak, khaiints'àn ts'àt shin dài' gwàt khaii tthak ezhìk gwizhìt gweech'in'. Shin dài' diyùughwan kat hàh gweech'in' aii th'ee school gwits'ee nìdhìzhih nuh Tr'ihchoo Distributor gitr'àhnuu k'ìighe'.

School gwichìilàgòodhat th'ee, dakaiik'ìt gwits'ee k'adhizhii ànts'àt ddhah tat gwà'àn laii hàh nahanzhok ganalndaih nùu. Shin dài' uutsik tr'ahgaii yi'eenjì' han niì'.

July 6, 1962 dài' t'at Mary zrit Frank Firth vatr'òonjik, William chants'àt Mary Firth goodinji' iinli'. Agadanh t'at tr'iinin tik geedi'in': Dwayne, Jeannie (d.) ànts'àt Darren kat hàh. 1960s tat chan yi'eedi' Inuvik nàgìnii'òo ezhìk danh ìnihłik gwà'àn Frank khanaandaii geenjit gwitr'it kàdhizhii Inuvik nàgogwiintthaih dài'. Aii th'ee 1970 t'at chan Teeth'it Zheh gwits'ee nagichìthìjil aii gwàts'at chan gwàa'an gogweech'in'. Jùk gweendòo aii niveh t'ah'ii geenjit khà'oodaa'in nilii ànts'àt geetàk hee goolàt kat geenjit k'e'jàhkài'.

Tr'iinin nilii dài' t'at Dinjii Khàihkai' giiyiinjigwichìl'e' ts'àt dànuu gwiizii giiyuudhìlch'eih. Ezhìk dài' gwànoo guk'àdagwidaadhat nilii ànts'àt tthak adagwidaandaii khanagaandaii geenjit.

Yee'òk nits'òo nàgwii'ee geenjit giikhii dài' t'at tthak ejùk gòodlit gwinah'in' nùu gwàt niizhit dài' gwànoo t'at gwiyendoo ak'oh gweedhàa gogwinah'in nùh. Nin chan ejùk gòodlit, jùk gweendòo nin diitat nàhaa'oo gwàt adài' gwànoo aii gwik'ìt elit akòo t'àgwiinch'ù'.

Jùk gweendòo aii k'eejît kat chan nits'òo diik'àgootr'ahnjik t'at ejùk chan goovàh gòonlìh. Adanh k'eejît nilii dài' t'at k'eejît kat chan gwiįzii diik'àgilnjik ànts'àt duuyeh too goozhik nihk'yùu natr'ahdadal kwàa. Tr'iinin kat googinjìk gagoovoonahtan niindhan ànts'àt nakhwek'yùu tthak chan ànts'àt jidìi tthak łoo hàh gik'àgahaandal geenjit gwiheezàa geenjit niindhan nùh.



Mary was born in the Yukon Territory (exact location is unknown) on December 23, 1935. She was one of 11 children born to the late John and Rebecca Modeste. Her maternal grandparents were Robert George Sintenilyin and Annie G.(Martin) and her paternal grandparents were Modeste Ts'idehdi' (Tsetetti) and Macrena.

As a child, Mary recalls living on the land with her parents and maternal grandparents. She was sent to All Saints Anglican School in Aklavik at the tender age of six. She spent the next six years traveling back and forth, spending the summer with her parents and in the fall returning to school from Fort McPherson via the Distributor and similar boats.

When she completed her education, she returned home to help her parents and used to travel by dog team throughout the mountains as far as the Yukon, where she spent the summer fishing.

On July 6, 1962, Mary was given in marriage to Frank Firth (d), son of the late William and Mary (Wilson) Firth. She bore Frank three children: Dwayne, Jeannie (d) and Darren. In the early 1960s they moved to Inuvik and Frank worked at various jobs while Inuvik was being built. In the mid 70s the family moved back to Fort McPherson. Today, she spends her time as a matron, guarding for the local RCMP and sews, to make a living.

She remembers the Chief when she was a child and how the people respected him and listened to what he had to say and the decisions he made. That was their government and everyone made their own living.

Mary says she has seen a lot of changes and recalls the winter weather was a lot colder in the past than it is today. The animals have changed as well, she thinks there are more animals around and in the community than when she was younger.

In her opinion, today's youth are being raised in a whole different way than when she was a child. Back then, children were well behaved and children were never out late as you see today. She would like to see children being taught their language and culture at an early age and for more to be spent on that than other subjects within the education system.
