

## Tabitha Nerysoo (Francis)

Tabitha zrit sriinanh February 6, 1927 dài' yi'eenjì' Tr'atr'aataii Tshik danh gwà'àn vagòonlìh. Viyùughwàn kat chan Brian, Lucy Francis hàh giinlì'. Vitì' ts'aii vìtsii vìtsuu kat hàh chan Chief Julius ditr'ìinjoo Maggie kat goovàazhii iinlì'. Vahanh ts'aii chan vìtsii vìtsuu kat chan William ditr'iinjoo Merika Vittrekwa giinlì'.

Nìch'it zhuu nilii dài', digiyùughwàn kat ts'àt dìtsii dìtsuu kat hàh ddhah tat gòo yeenjì' Tl'oondìh gwà'àn gogweech'ìn'. K'eejìt nilii dài' t'at yi'eedì' Aklavik gwizhìt School geenjit nèetr'ìnyahchih khaii tik gahshùk th'ee chan digiyùughwan kat hàh gweech'in ganadhindaih nùh. Troo gòo łyuu shìk tr'it'ii ànts'àt yeelil łaii hàh. Shìk gwitr'it t'agwaa'ii ànts'àt duuyeh khè' daach'uh nilìi.

Aii tł'ee zrit, ts'èhch'in nilii dài' Peter Nerysoo vatr'òonjìk, vitr'ìinjòo vakwaa ànts'àt tr'iinin

neekaii di'ii. Aii th'ee nìch'it ihhee Mary Ruth eedi'in' ànts'àt Richard giiyùunjìk. Dachan tat shìk gogwiindai' aii th'ee digii kat school gwits'àt geedaa geenjit gàgàdhan, Fleming Hall, Teeth'it Zheh gwizhìt gootr'inyahchih aii th'ee Stringer Hall Inuvik danh chan. Peter chan ts'àt Tabitha hàh tth'aih dachan tat adagogwidaandai' nàtr'aazrii, huk kàageedi'i' ànts'àt khyah t'agah'in' khaii shin gwitak gwìnyàanch'uh dài'. Nihkhàh nagwidàdhat tik gwijùutin ànts'àt nihk'iidaankat gweedhaa gwàt nihkhan goovàh srugòonch'uu ganadhindaih.

K'eejìt nilii dài' khaii gwiyaa'an łòo gwinìink'oo ganalndaii gwàt jùk gweendòo zrit akòo t'agwiinch'uh kwàa gwàt tth'aih nihk'yùu natr'ahdinjìk.
Gwinìink'oo geenjit gwiizrii nàgaazhii gwàt geenjit ginjih leii dhitsii kwàa, digilìk hàh tr'aagik aii k'ìighe' srìigogwandàih.

Tabitha was born on February 6, 1927 at Trail Creek in the Yukon. Her parents were the late Brian and Lucy (Salu) Francis. Her paternal grandparents were the late Chief Julius and Maggie (Vittrekwa) Salu. Her maternal grandparents were the late William and Merika Vittrekwa (Neyando).

Most of Tabitha's childhood was spent living out on the land with her parents and grandparents in the mountains and at Tl'oondih. When she was young, Tabitha went to school in Aklavik for three years and after returning she again joined her parents out on the land. She was always working with either wood or hauling ice. She remembers having to do her daily chores and kept herself busy.

Later on, when she was still a young woman she married the late Peter Nerysoo; a widower who had two children from a previous marriage. Tabitha bore Peter one daughter Mary Ruth Wilson and adopted a son Richard. They lived mainly out on the land and when her children were of school age, they were sent to Fleming Hall in Fort McPherson and later on to Stringer Hall in Inuvik. Peter and Tabitha continued to live out on the land hunting, fishing and trapping and following the seasons. They were together for 38 years and had many good times together.

When Tabitha was younger she recalls that it was colder than it is today, however, they endured and traveled where they had to despite the weather. They were dressed for it and it wasn't a big issue to them, as working and running with their dog teams was enough to keep them fit and healthy.

When speaking about the youth of today, Tabitha sighs and says that she would like to see the children begin to take an interest in their Native language and speak it more often.
